

Understanding Error Codes

Misinterpreting WCEPOLS error codes can delay acceptance and increase resubmissions. Understanding them helps resolve issues faster.



Find

the record identified by the error code



Locate

the field using the starting position



Review

the error type in the [PDM Edit Matrix](#) to understand the rule



Correct

the issue in your source system, not just the outbound file, to prevent reoccurring errors.

Tip: Repeated errors for the same field often indicate mapping, configuration, or source system data issues.

How It Works

WCEPOLS error codes answer two key questions:

Where is the problem?

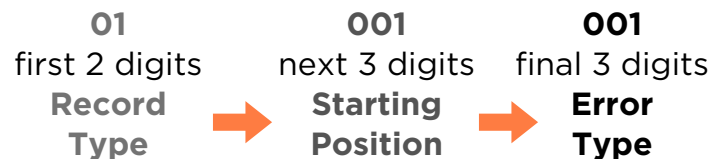
Record type and field position.

Why did it fail?

The specific validation rule.

WCEPOLS error codes contain three components. For example, in the following error code:

01001001



This approach reduces guesswork and promotes consistency in error correction.

IMPACT

Failure to properly interpret and resolve errors may result in:

- Rejected or delayed policy submissions
- Inaccurate or incomplete policy records
- Increased rework and resubmissions
- Potential reporting compliance issues

Promptly and accurately addressing errors leads to:

- Faster acceptance
- Cleaner data
- Smoother reporting cycles
